I love the way the author describes January's feelings towards her father, that she still loves him even though he did terrible things and decieved both her and her mother.

Shadi is January's best friend and her long-distance supporter. Shadi is presented as a positive character in the book, and you can tell that they are always there for each other. I enjoyed how Emily Henry describes the feelings of loss, grief, love, and confusion.
